The Maxine Goodman Levin College at Cleveland State University is one of the top ten urban affairs schools in the nation. U.S. News & World Report: "America's Best Graduate Schools" 2008 ranked it number two in the nation for its city management / urban policy graduate specialty.

The College offers 14 degree programs that equip students with the technical and management skills needed to launch careers in fields such as public management, planning, public safety, historic preservation, environmental studies, economic development and housing. Degree completion programs are available for community college transfer students with A.A., A.A.S., or A.A.B. degrees in human services, health sciences, paralegal studies, police science, environmental health and safety technology, emergency management, or fire science.

Urban Studies Major

As an Urban Studies major, you will learn to analyze the problems of urban areas and evaluate possible solutions. You will explore public policy initiatives that promote better decisions by cities, and you will discover how to build in smarter, more sustainable ways. Your courses will come from the fields of geography, economics, political science, urban planning, statistics, environmental studies and public management.

You may choose one or more specializations from the following areas:

- Urban Planning
- Urban Management
- Environmental Policy & Management
- Historic Preservation
- Geographic Information Systems

Levin College offers an accelerated BA+MPA program, which leads to a Master of Public Administration in as few as five years of full-time study. The major is also offered at Lorain County Community College's University Partnership.

What is the career outlook for a degree in Urban Studies?

Graduates of the Levin College work in the public, private and nonprofit sectors including human services agencies, health care, local government, public safety, community development, housing and environmental advocacy. They work as urban planners, GIS technicians, budget analysts, community development specialists, grant writers, and managers. A major in Urban Studies is good preparation for law school, or for graduate study in Public Administration, Urban Planning, Environmental Studies, or Urban Studies. Career Services assistance is available at the college through job postings, government and post-graduate internship opportunities, and a mentoring program.

The Cleveland State Career Services Office offers career counseling, interview preparation and resume review on site. The required urban studies internship gives students practical experience in settings designed to complement their degree program.

The Bachelor of Arts in Urban Studies curriculum takes full advantage of its location in a major urban setting in fulfilling its commitment to urban education, research and community service.

The curriculum utilizes the resources of the Levin College and other related departments throughout the University for its interdisciplinary academic program. Students pursuing the Urban Studies major take courses and seminars dealing directly with urban problems and their solutions. The major can be completed in the evening.

Bachelor of Arts in Urban Studies

A total of 128 hours is required for the Bachelor of Arts in Urban Studies. All degree seeking students are required to complete a specific number of General Education (GenEd) courses. Students are responsible for ensuring the appropriate selection of courses to satisfy GenEd requirements and are encouraged to consult with their academic advisor regarding the applicability of selected courses.
