

URBAN STUDIES at Levin.

The M.S. in Urban Studies is an interdisciplinary degree program designed to broaden and extend students' knowledge and expertise in order to actively engage in urban problem solving. Students with a wide range of urban interests will find this comprehensive degree program to be excellent preparation for working in the field or further graduate study.

Students obtain a foundation of urban structure, history, economics, finance, and analysis through a core curriculum. Students then have the flexibility to design their own specialization, choose an existing area of specialization, or choose not to specialize.

M.S. in Urban Studies graduates hold leadership positions in the public, nonprofit, and private sectors, including: Center for Community Solutions, Cleveland Restoration Society, Playhouse Square, Team NEO, NOACA, the City of Cleveland, the Ohio House of Representatives. The diversity and breadth of classes offered by the M.S. in Urban Studies prepares students for a wide range of careers, or for doctoral study.

Students can specialize in one of the following areas:

- + Community and Neighborhood Development
- + Economic Development
- + Public Finance
- + Urban and Public Policy
- + Urban Real Estate Development

GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Graduate Assistantships and scholarships are competitive, and are awarded to qualified students who have been admitted to Urban Affairs graduate degree programs. Candidates must have an undergraduate or graduate GPA of 3.0 or higher to qualify for and retain a graduate assistantship.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the M.S. in Urban Studies Program must meet the minimum requirements established by the College of Graduate Studies and the M.S. program faculty:

- + A minimum undergraduate grade-point average of 3.0.
- + Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores, with an average Verbal and Quantitative score at the 40th percentile, and an Analytical Writing score of at least 4.0. Students with a graduate degree from an accredited U.S. college or university are exempted from this requirement. Other standardized admission examinations may be substituted at the discretion of the Program Director.
- + Two letters of recommendation, preferably from faculty.
- + Non-native English speakers must demonstrate English-language proficiency.
